

I bought one, and it really works. I get totally decent internet for a monthly bill of zero.

What's the catch? Well for free you only get 500MB of data per month. But that may be plenty! The other issue is that they use Sprint WiMax, which has spotty coverage. But that may also be OK if it has coverage where you want to use it. Check their coverage before buying. If anything, I've found it works in more places than I expected it to.

Yes, it really is free. Except for buying the device, which cost me \$106 delivered. You can return it within a year for a refund. There is no monthly fee.... Unless you go over 500 MB of data, or under 5 mb of data. There is a 99 cent fee for not using at least 5 mb in a month. But, hey, it all seems very reasonable to me! Especially when comparing against a data plan that I don't need every month. I got the "Photon" unit so it works with iPad, iPod Touch, iPhone, laptop, any wifi device. Have you ever wished you had an extra 500 mb of data available on your iPhone plan?


