


Enable Windows-Like Features on Your Mac

For both power users and luddites alike, moving from a Windows PC to a Mac can be a confusing leap. In the previous tutorial, Alex talked about <u>The 5 Things You Must Know When Converting</u> <u>From Windows to Mac</u>.
